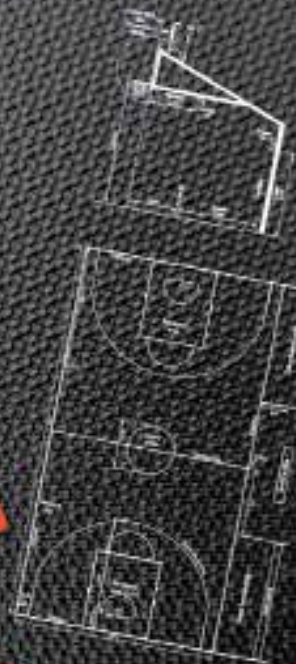

It's all change for the Trailblazers

As we alluded in tonight's welcome column, the Trailblazers team which sets foot on court at Moorways this evening will bear little resemblance to the team which clinched the National Trophy, finished runners up in the Play-Offs and third in the league last season. So it's over to Head Coach Jamie Maudsley to explain all that's been happening:

"I think we've had more guys move on from the club in one season than ever before. For some of them, like Rema [Lascelles] and Josh [Guddemi], it's a natural progression, as they move on to colleges in the States, so we're really happy for them. (You can read more about exactly where they're going to later on in tonight's match programme – Ed) For a couple more, it's testament to how they performed last year that they've earned better contracts elsewhere.



"Sadly, we've also lost Dave Attewell and Mark Woodhouse over the summer, because they've both been fantastic servants to the club. Dave's personally been with me for a very long time and it's going to be strange not having him around. He was looking to play one more season and he was starting to get into a really good pre-season, but unfortunately he's had quite a big knee injury which means he's not going to be able to play. I'm really sorry for Dave, both from a personal perspective and from the perspective of how much the team will miss him.

"I think Woody has been with us for three or four years too and in that time, he's been great. He's often played through injury and he's done everything that we've asked him to do, but he's decided that this is the time to take a break. He's got a young son and he's been a full time basketball player for something like thirteen or fourteen seasons, so he thoroughly deserves to have a bit of time off to recharge his batteries. Hopefully, in a years' time, things may be different for him.



"Rishi [Kakad] has got a really good deal in Italy and we wish him well and we really believe he's going to be a success out there. Aaron [Maher] has also been given an opportunity to go out to Europe, so there's no question it's going to be different for us this season, but we're proud that we've been able to play a part in their development and give them an opportunity to become professional basketball players.



"Troy [Whittington] was obviously over here on a one year deal through our partnership with Derby University, so he'll be heading back shortly, but we're at an advanced stage in getting two guys over here for the new season, the first of whom should be on court against Westminster, if all goes according to plan.

"We're looking to develop that link with the University to make it much stronger and to that extent, we're looking to send students from our own Academy to study there and Benson Arogbo will be the first of those from this month. I'll also be coaching at the University from this season, so we're looking for that pathway to develop to enable guys to stay in Derby and also to attract others in as they start to realise they can get a good basketball education without leaving the city. I'm hoping we'll have three or four guys on that University team that can really help us in division one and there's also going to be some guys there that can help our developmental programmes.

"We will have some continuity though, because Stedroy Baker, Jamie McGaffin and Martyn Gayle will all be back with us and we're still hoping Eric Milambo will sign too. All of those guys did well for us last season. Martyn will have more of a leadership role this year, as he'll be my co-captain, along with Steddy. We'd like to see him developing the leadership skills that he's already got and Steddy will be continuing in his same role as player/assistant coach and co-captain. I think he adapted to that really well last year and I certainly benefitted from him being more of a coaching figure both at practice and in games.



"Jamie McGaffin is a great figure for us. He does whatever we ask of him and we're delighted that Simon Alloway has decided to join us again for another crack at division one, after a year away at Nottingham. I think everyone knows

what he's capable of doing for us and it won't take him long to slot back into things. And Tom Sherlock also returns to the club where he started as a junior, having spent the last couple of seasons in the BBL with Leicester Riders. Obviously I would have liked to have brought more people back, but circumstances and opportunities for others mean we'll be a very different looking side this season.



"In addition to those names, we're looking at bringing some guys through from the division three and four teams and the Academy too. Coaches Shaw, Squire and Bowen have done a great job in terms of developing talent and I've been really impressed with what they've shown they're capable of during our summer practices. We're trying to create the mentality that no-one is guaranteed anything but that anyone who produces on the floor could find themselves playing at any level throughout our senior programme.

"It was a little bit disappointing that we couldn't get our season underway on time last weekend, but I'm trying to get frustrated about things I can't do anything about and unfortunately, that was one such situation. We couldn't play at Moorways and while our new facilities at Noel-Baker were supposed to be ready at the start of September, we're still not in there. We were hoping to stage a number of pre-season games in there, which we've not been able to do because of delays on the construction project. I'm pleased that we've managed to reschedule it and I'm hopeful that when we do get in there, it will live to our expectations of it.



University Bound



For the whole of his basketball career, Rema Lascelles has had it drilled into him that travelling is a negative aspect to the game, but he'll certainly have to get used to long journeys, after gaining a full scholarship to play and study at Hawaii Pacific University (HPU). Lascelles, who was MVP when the Trailblazers Basketball Academy won the national title in March, is expected to play as a point guard for HPU and is very enthusiastic about the prospect of life in Hawaii: "I'm very excited about studying and playing basketball in Hawaii, I have heard nothing but good things about the university from everyone I have spoken to so it such be quite an experience," he said.

Coach Matt Shaw added: "We're delighted for Rema. He has made a huge contribution to the Trailblazers over several years and I expect him to be a big success in the States. I'm sure everyone at the club will be keeping a close eye on his progress."

Rema was a major part of the 2009 U18s national championship side and was in the starting five, despite being aged just sixteen at the time. More recently, he started for the D1 men's team which won the 2012 National Trophy. He also captained the Academy side to the National Championship title in March 2012. "It will be hard to replace a player of Rema's quality," Shaw said. "He has such a great understanding of the game and does so many things well on the court, but our club philosophy is about player development and we are delighted to see him have such a great opportunity. We always encourage players to play at the highest possible level and actively seek opportunities like this for them."

HPU play in the PAC West conference, travelling via plane to mainline America to play all of their away conference games and many pre conference exhibition games. HPU is located in the island of Oahu which is a region in the area of Honolulu. Derby does have some history with HPU but in the past, it has normally been with players heading from Hawaii to Derby, rather than the other way round. Trailblazers outgoing Player of the Season Rishi Kakad spent three happy years there playing for coach Vorderbruegge and it was Rishi who suggested Rema to his former coach. Going even further back London born Andy Gardiner played at HPU in the early 1990s before joining the Derby

Bucks where he played alongside Rema's father Tim during one of the Derby's most successful basketball periods. Gardiner went on to have a hugely successful professional career across mainline Europe.

Derby has also seen a former HPU coach at the helm too, as Steve Tucker was head coach at HPU in the late 80s before spending a short time coaching the Derby Storm in 1997. With an average temperature year round above 70 degrees, let's hope Lascelles has remembered to pack his shorts and tee shirts.



Meanwhile, Josh Guddemi has headed across the Atlantic to attend New Haven University after being offered a full scholarship. Josh had several scholarship opportunities after attending an exposure camp in Philadelphia and chose New Haven, a top NCAA II program because he liked the location, the university size and the basketball program. Frequently players in their freshman year don't see the floor too often, but Coach Hotaling expects Josh to contribute from day one. New Haven University, nicknamed the Chargers is located in Connecticut and play in the Northeast-10 Conference. Last season they finished with a 15-13 winning record.

Josh has attended the Derby Trailblazer Academy for the last two years as an AASE student, playing for the academy and also the Trailblazer men's division 1 team. Travelling daily from Nottingham Josh has shown dedication not only as an athlete but also a student, recently passing his three A-levels. Assistant Coach Paul Bowen commented: "Josh has been a huge success and a great ambassador for our program. On the court in training and games his attitude has always been outstanding. We are delighted he has earned this opportunity."

Guddemi's attitude and ability has not only resulted in a numerous scholarship offers. He also won the British Colleges Sports Personality of the Year award; a nationwide award that recognises not only outstanding sporting achievement but also takes into account students grades and their contribution to the local community. There is no doubt that New Haven got themselves a great student athlete when they selected Josh.

Academy Coach Matt Shaw confirmed Josh will be sorely missed: "On the court you don't find too many players with Josh's skill set - that will be hard for our academy and our Men's team to replace. But we will also be sad to lose the camaraderie he brings to the squad and I know his teammates will miss him as a friend too. As a club we always push players to further themselves and this is certainly a great opportunity we have encouraged Josh to take."

A number of other Trailblazers Academy graduates are also moving on, albeit to slightly less exotic locations, as Coach Shaw explains:

"Matt Basi achieved the required grades to attend his chosen university Sheffield. The 6'4 forward from Littleover, Derby had an excellent year at Academy level saving his best performance for the national final where he collected 8 rebounds and 8 points. Basi also played for the Trailblazer D4 squad. We hope Matt will continue to play at EBL club level with one of the teams in Sheffield. Matt will be majoring in Game software development at Sheffield Hallam.

"For Ollie Stanley all roads lead to Birmingham. He will be studying at the City of Birmingham University starting this September. Ollie, who started his basketball career late, was among the most improved players on last years'

team. He had a record 7 blocks for the Blazer u18 team v Worchester in March. After gaining good A-level grades he will be studying Graphic Design for the next three years. We hope Ollie will continue to play in the EBL for one of the Birmingham based teams.

"We're also delighted that Benson Arogbo will be staying in Derby to attend Derby University this autumn. Benson won the award as 'academy hardest working player' in 2012 and also shared the players' player award. Benson had a season high 25 points versus Burliegh College back in November and averaged 11 points per game for the EBL division 4 side. Benson will be part of the Derbyshire Institute of Sport (DIS) program (see <http://www.teamderby.com/institute.php> for more details) This partnership between Derby city and county councils, Derby University and Derby Trailblazers is aimed at developing elite sports performances and we are thrilled to have Benson, who is originally from Nottingham remain with the club and take advantage of this new initiative.

In addition, a couple of our 2012 graduates are taking a gap year before attending university in 2013 and several entering the world of work. Trailblazers would like to thank them all for their efforts during their team with the academy and with the club and wish them all the best for the future.
