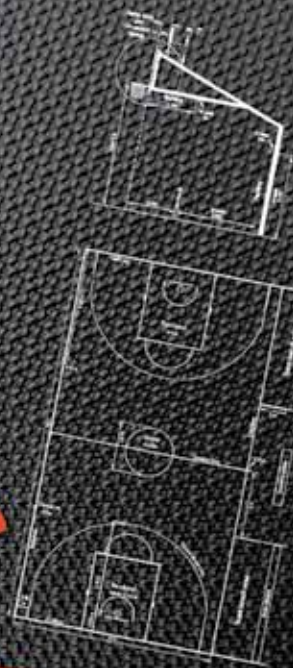

We welcome Hemel Storm to Moorways for the first time at division one level. The club may be relatively new in its current form, but there is a good tradition of basketball in Hemel, as they used to have a BBL franchise.

There are plenty of familiar faces within their coaching and playing staff, not least Coach Dave Titmuss, who led Reading Rockets to their remarkable clean sweep a few seasons ago, in which they remained unbeaten in all four competitions.

Last weekend was a mixed one for the Trailblazers. It was great to get back to winning ways against Medway Park Crusaders on Saturday, but it was equally disappointing to be eliminated from the EBL Trophy on Sunday, particularly as it was the title which Derby had won in such emphatic style against Bristol Academy Flyers last season.

The return of Kingsley Okoroh played a big part in the success over Medway Park. With a full week of training under his belt, he showed a much better understanding of the systems and fell just short of a double-double, finishing with 9 points, 14 rebounds and 7 blocked shots. It's great to have him back with the club for the remainder of the season after a spell in the USA.

On Sunday, the U16's made a major achievement, as they beat Medway Park Crusaders to advance to the semi-final of the Sureshot U16 Boys Cup. I'm pretty sure this is the first time any of our junior teams has advanced to the semi-final of the Cup and the good news is, they have been drawn at home to Trafford. The match will be played at Noel-Baker on Sunday February 3rd at 2:30pm. It would be great to get the place packed out, so please put the date into your diaries and come along to support Coach Andy Josephs and his lads.

It was a fabulous weekend for the U16's, who thrashed Cheshire Panthers 93-44 on Saturday, before travelling to Kent, where they beat Medway Park Crusaders 76-65 in the quarter final of the Sureshot National Cup.

Tonight's Visitors – Hemel Storm

Tonight's match will be the first meeting between the two clubs, after Hemel earned promotion last season. That said, there are a lot of familiar faces amongst the players and staff of the club. The match also marks the half way point of the league season. Assistant Coach Steve Baxter looks ahead:

"We will be looking for a strong showing against the only team we have not played so far this year. Last week we got a much needed league win against Medway and we need to kick on from that this week against Hemel who have started out their first season in division one fairly well. Like us, quite a few of their losses have been by close margins which can be frustrating. With our record being as it is, every game carries increased importance. Despite being out of both cup competitions, we still have the league and hopefully the playoffs to focus on and we need to stay focused for every minute of every game.

"I have heard good things about the set up at Hemel; they have a wealth of coaching experience and like us they will look to kick on from their early season form. They have built a team there with a nice mix of youth and experience. They don't have any one or two guys who dominate their scoring but instead, they have five or six who could lead their team on any given night, which means that often whoever they have on the floor is a scoring threat and we need to be aware of that. We know they are going to play hard for forty minutes and we will need to match their energy and intensity at both ends of the court.

"As a team we are getting used to having Kingsley in the team and we felt he played excellently against Medway last week. Adding someone of Kingsley's size does bring another dimension to the team and it also meant that, along with Jeff returning from injury, we had 4 post players to rotate, which was not something we have been able to do much this season. This gives us more balance and options to change when things are not working, or to give guys a rest when they are. We have to be careful to remember that like a few of our other guys, Kingsley is still young and we therefore mustn't put too much expectation on his shoulders.

"We also shot the ball much better last week. Getting our shooters good looks at the basket is something that we have been working hard at in training and we need to keep doing that to win games. Martyn, Simon, Nick, Luke and Jamie are all excellent shooters, but too often this season we have made things more difficult for ourselves by not executing well enough. If we get our guys good looks at the basket I am confident in their ability to convert at a higher percentage," he said.

Dru Spinks 6'4 Guard/Forward

Dru moved to the Storm from MK Lions in the BBL in 2010 where he had played since making his debut in 1996. He proved influential to last years Storm team which won promotion to Division 1, leading the team in scoring at over 21ppg. He brings energy, hustle and leadership to the team and often had the task of marking the opposition's best scorer. Has seen his scoring decrease this year to just over 13ppg (third on the team) and is Hemel's second leading rebounder at over five per game.

Williamz Omope 6'5 Forward

Another player who brings top level experience to the Storm is Williamz Omope, who has previously suited up for Eastside Eagles, Birmingham Panthers, Mansfield Giants, Nottingham Knights and of course Derby for a few months of the 2008/9 season. He averaged 19 points and 7 rebounds per game last year at Eastside in Division 2 and is contributing 10ppg this season. Williamz is an athletic forward who rebounds hard and can hit the outside shot.

Tom Adorian 6'9 Centre

Twenty-seven year old Tom is a newcomer to the Storm this year after his move from Brixton Topcats. He gives the Storm a welcome inside presence and is a renowned hard worker at both ends of the court. Tom is currently averaging a double double of 10 points and 11 rebounds per game (fourth in the league). His previous clubs include London Towers and Mansfield Giants. Tom's excellent play last year earned him a spot in the Eurobasket all domestic starting five.

Louis Sayers 6'6 Forward

After taking a year out whilst attending University at Brunel, the former Reading Rocket has slotted back into EBL 1 with ease. An excellent athlete, Louis can drive and convert at the basket or connect from long range. He has represented England/GB at both junior and university level and is currently averaging over 15 points and 4 rebounds per game.

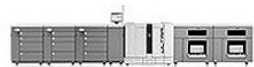
Bode Adeluola 5'10 Guard

Pacey guard Bode is in his second year with Hemel and was third in scoring in last years' promotion winning team with over 15ppg. Bode likes to push the ball up the court quickly where he attacks the basket well. He is no stranger to division 1 having previously suited up for Brixton Topcats and London Mets he leads this years team in scoring at almost 16 per game and is fourth in the league in assists with almost five per game.

Kingsley helps to sink Medway's crusade

Seventeen year old Kingsley Okoroh played a big role in helping Derby Trailblazers to return to winning ways as he finished just shy of a double-double in points and rebounds (9 and 14), but he also added a staggering seven blocked shots, as he used his size to great effect against the much smaller opposition. Promoted to the starting five, he didn't disappoint, according to assistant coach Steve Baxter:

"We decided to give Kingsley a start as Medway are a fairly small team and thought his height could cause them problems. That proved to be the case and I thought he did fantastically well. He had to play extended minutes as Eric [Milambo] felt a bit of an ankle injury at half time so we did not want to risk aggravating it in the 2nd half. The return of Jeff [Smith] from injury also meant we had four post players available, and along with Tom [Brown], they all did a good job for us.

"The win was an important one for us in terms of league play, because it came against a team who were one win above us. Statistically that was the second best we have shot the ball from the three-point line all season. We also did a really good job of forcing Medway off the three-point line. That is one of Medway best strengths and in general we did a good job of challenging their shooters," he said.

The Crusaders converted just five of 31 shots from beyond the arc, with Captain James Harris going 0/7 from downtown against Derby's strong perimeter defence. At the opposite end of the court, the Blazers converted 42% of their long range attempts, with Martyn Gayle leading the way with five of ten attempts.

The Blazers produced a strong first quarter and a three-pointer from Simon Allaway ensured they were 25-15 ahead by the time the first buzzer sounded. The second period was problematical for Derby, as they struggled to establish any kind of offensive rhythm. They were outscored 18-8 as Medway Park powered their way to 33-all at the break.

Derby were struggling to control Mannoek Lual and Disraeli Lufadeju, with the former adding 24 rebounds to his 19 points and capitalising on several second and third chance scoring opportunities. But the Blazers did enough to keep their noses in front, leading 46-44 going into the final ten minutes.

It was then that Nick Rose finally got into the game. He had been hampered by foul trouble and had seen limited court time as a result, but 15 of his 17 points were scored in the final quarter. A fifth foul on Cole Hobin helped his cause as the Canadian had caused him problems earlier in the game and been the benefactor of three of the American's four fouls.

Derby took the final quarter 26-13 to secure an important league victory, which moved them up to tenth place in the VCARS.co.uk division one league table.

Derby's defence of Trophy title ended by Leopards

Derby Trailblazers defence of the EBL Men's Trophy was brought to a sudden halt at the quarter final stage by Essex Leopards. The home side were clearly keen to avenge the heavy league defeat they had suffered at Derby's expense six weeks earlier. Their Coach Robert Youngblood had described that 80-65 defeat as their worst performance of the season, but they responded with their best showing of the current campaign.

They out-rebounded Derby at both ends of the court and their strong defensive performance saw the Blazers reduced to shooting just 31% from the floor overall and 17% from beyond the arc. Simon Allaway was in fact the only Trailblazers player who managed to score from outside, netting three of his six attempts on his way to 11 points. Teammate Martyn Gayle was 0/6, but still managed to finish the game as Derby's top scorer on 17 points, helped by 7/9 from the free-throw line.

In contrast, Leopards shot the ball much better. Their overall figures were 46% from the field and 31% from beyond the arc. Simon Cummings netted 3/5 from downtown on his way to 15 points, while Greg Hernandez and Taner Adu, both of whom had a torrid time in the defeat at Moorways, also put in much better performances on their home court.

Against the taller and more powerful Leopards line-up, Kingsley Okoroh wasn't able to dominate in the same way as he had against Medway Park the

day before. He finished with four points and three rebounds, but of the post players, it was Jeff Smith who really shone. In his best performance to date, he shot 4/4 from the field and captured eight rebounds, on his way to finishing the game with the highest efficiency ranking.

Derby were 24-14 down by the end of the first quarter and after 24-10 second period, they went into the locker room having been outscored 2-1 by the Leopards throughout the first half. The Blazers improved after the break, losing the third period 15-13 before taking the final quarter 22-18, but it was too little, too late.

Derby's involvement in the competition which they had won in such emphatic style the previous season was over, but on reflection, securing the two league points against Medway Park Crusaders 24 hours earlier was probably a much more important result.
